

Sickness children, accidents and vaccination Policy

Sick children

A sick child may not come to the day care centre. We are unable to give your child the extra care that they need. By a sick child, we mean a child that:

- clearly does not feel well
- is complaining about pain
- has a recognised illness and/or
- has a temperature higher than 38.5°.

If you are unsure, you can always ask us for advice.

If your child becomes ill during the day at the Kattekop, we then take their temperature, we keep a close eye on your child and we will call you when we feel that it would be better for you to come and collect them.

Accidents

If there is an accident, we call the child's parents immediately. In an emergency, it could well be that we first go with the child to a hospital and we then call the child's parents. Even if it is a small injury, we always call the child's parents to inform them. You don't necessarily have to come and collect your child.

The day care employees take a First Aid course with a special emphasis on children. They do a refresher course every year.

Vaccination Policy

We have based our vaccination policy on the recommendations of the RIVM (Dutch National Institute for Public Health). Based on this, all children are welcome to come to the day care centre, even children who have not been vaccinated. In order to create a safe environment, more than 95% of all children should have been vaccinated. We easily meet this requirement. That is why we need to know that all of the children follow the Government Vaccination Programme. As soon as it is known that there is an infectious disease going round, we immediately inform all parents. When appropriate, we consult the Community Health Service (GGD in Dutch) and decide which measures we should take.
